The Marysville Kiwanis Club established this scholarship with a donation from Dr Charles B Mills, for his interest in education and youth, and dedication to Kiwanis of which he was a past president and served on numerous committees for the benefit of the organization. The scholarship honors the father of the donor, Charles D Mills MD, who was charter president of the Marysville Kiwanis Club in 1923.

The purpose of the scholarship is to encourage qualified students of the Marysville High School to seek education beyond high school and to provide financial assistance. The scholarship will be awarded annually in the amount of \$1,000.00. The scholarship will be non-renewable, that is, a different student will receive the award each year.

The scholarship will be awarded to a graduating senior at the Marysville High School who is planning to attend a four-year baccalaureate degree program. Qualities of character, industriousness, integrity, need, class ranking and perseverance will be considerations taken by the scholarship committee. The committee will also take under consideration if any of your relatives are member of Kiwanis or if you are a Key Club member.

Requirements for each applicant:

1. The application must be completed in full. The committee will not consider an application not completed in full. The completed application must be mailed prior to April 16 to: Marysville Kiwanis Club, Dr C D Mills Memorial-Kiwanis College Scholarship, P O Box 340, Marysville, Ohio, 43040.
2. The applicant must be a graduating senior at Marysville High School at the time of application.
3. The applicant must state the school to which an application for admission is to be made. Although scholarships may be awarded before notice of admission, they are conditioned upon the enrollment of the applicant in an undergraduate course in a recognized college or university. The committee reserves the right to determine whether the school selected qualifies under this definition. The scholarship check will be made payable both to the school and to the applicant.
4. Three recommendations must be submitted in addition to the application, but not accompanying it. Forms for the recommendations will be provided with the application and should be mailed separately by the recommending person to the above address of the committee. One recommendation should be made by a teacher; one either by a guidance counselor or principal; and one by a former employer or a responsible person in the community in which the applicant lives.
5. A transcript of the applicant's high school grades must be mailed to the above address. Request this from either your principal or high school counselor.
